

Description of Port Vila Flag

Port Vila is on Efate Island. Its flag is white, with a nearly square version of the national flag in the upper hoist, and in the centre a burgundy disk bearing the coat of arms and the words Ville de Port Vila arched above the arms and City of Port Vila below.



Brief background of Port Vila municipality

Port Vila is the capital and largest city of Vanuatu situated on the coast of the island of Efate, in the Shefa Province, the city population at last cencus (1999) was 29,356, an increase of 55% on the previous census result (1989). This suggests a 2007 population of about 40,000 or around 65% of the province's population. Port Vila is the economic and commercial centre of Vanuatu.

The area occupied by Port Vila has been inhabited by Melanesian people for thousands of years. In autumn of 2004, an archaeological expedition known as Teouma discovered a burial site of 25 tombs containing three dozen skeletons of members of the Lapita culture. Pieces of ceramics found at the site were dated to the 13th century BCE.

In May of 1606, the first Europeans arrived at the island, led by Pedro Fernandez de Quiros and Luis Vaez de Torres. In the 19th century when the islands were known as the New Herrides, the British possessed economic control of the zone, though by the end of 1880, the economic balance began to favor the French; this transition can be seen in its nickel mines of New Caledonia and plantations. French citizen Ferdinand Chevillard began buying and clearing land around Port Vila to be converted into the largest French plantation on the island. Instead, it was converted into the municipality of Franceville,

which declared independence on August 9, 1889, though this only lasted until June of the following year. It was the first self-governing nation to practice universal suffrage without distinction of sex or race. Although the population at the time consisted of about 500 native islanders and less than 50 whites, only the latter were permitted to hold office. One of the elected presidents was a U.S. citizen by birth, R.D. POLK, a relative of American president James K. Polk.

After 1887, the territory was jointly administered by the French and the British. This was formalized in 1906 as an Anglo-French Condominium. During World War II, Port Vila was an American and Australian airbase. In 1987, cyclone Uma severely damaged the city. A powerful earthquake in January 2002 caused extensive damage in the capital and surrounding areas.

Bislama is spoken by everyone as the day-to-day language. In addition, English and French are also widespread. Other Indigenous languages are also spoken in the city.

Christianity is the predominant religion across Vanuatu, followed by more than 90% of the population. The largest denomination is the Presbyterian Church in Vanuatu, followed by one third of the population. The Presbyterian Church of Port Vila is an impressive and sight worthy building opposite the Independence Park. Roman Catholicism and the Church of Melanesia are also common, each about 15%. Cathedrale du Sacre-Coueur is a modern Roman Catholic cathedral in Port Vila. The seat of the Diocese of Port Vila, the church is dedicated to the sacred heart of Joan of Arc.

Port Vila has a tropical climate, with a dry season and a hot, wet session. Rainfall averages about 2,360 millimeters (94 in.) per year, and the wettest month is April. The driest month is September. There are 113 wet days in an average year. The area also has south-east trade winds. Temperatures do not vary very much at all throughout the year, and the record high is 34 C (93.2 F). The coldest month, August, has an average high of 24 C (75.2 F), and an average low of 18 C (64.4 F). The hottest month, February, has an average high of 29 C (84.2 F) and an average low of 23 C (73.4 F). The record low for Port Vila is 12 C (53.6 F). Humidity is often high.

Port Vila Economics

Port Vila is Vanuatu's most important harbour and the center of the country's trade. The international airport, Bauerfield International (VLI) is also located in the city.


Major industries in the city remain agriculture and fishing. Tourism is also becoming important, especially from Australia and New Zealand. There were over 50,000 visitors in 1997.

Vanuatu is a tax haven, and offshore financing in Port Vila is an important part of the economy.

Vanuatu is still dependent on foreign aid, most of which comes from Australia and New Zealand, although in recent years aid has also come from the People's Republic of China. Air Vanuatu has its head office in the Vanuatu House in Port Vila.

35.7% of exports leave from Port Vila and 86.9% of imports arrive in Port Vila.







Aim and purpose:

The aims and purpose of the Office of the Public Prosecutor are as follows;

- (a) to institute, prepare and conduct preliminary enquiries; and
- **(b)** to institute, prepare and conduct on behalf of the State, prosecutions for offences in any court; and
- **(c)** to institute, prepare and conduct, on behalf of the State appeals in any court in respect of prosecutions; and
- (d) to conduct, on behalf of the State as respondent, any appeal in any court in respect of prosecutions; and
- **(e)** if requested by the Attorney General to do so, to institute, prepare and conduct on behalf of the State, or be a party to, proceedings under legislation dealing with proceeds of crime, mutual assistance or extradition; and
- (f) to discontinue prosecutions regardless of who instituted them; and
- **(g)** if requested to do so, to give advice to members of the Vanuatu Police Force and any other investigators in relation to investigations, proposed prosecutions or prosecutions; and
- (h) to provide assistance in obtaining search warrants; and
- (i) to prosecute breaches of the Leadership Code [Cap. 240]; and
- (j) such other functions that are conferred on the Public Prosecutor by this Act or any other law.

Introduction

VWC's national network includes the main centre in Port Vila, 3 Branches, a vibrant rural network of 41 Committees Against Violence Against Women (CAVAWs) and a national network of male advocates trained by VWC's program. The 3 Branches are: Sanma Counselling Centre (SCC), Tafea Counselling Centre (TCC), and Torba Counselling Centre (ToCC).
